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A Note from the Associate Dean Research, the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences, the University of Melbourne.

As ADR in MDHS I have responsibility for the strategic direction of research in the University of Melbourne's largest Faculty, which is ranked as the 9th best Faculty of Medicine internationally by the Times Higher Education Rankings. While this is a lofty position, we face many challenges to keep our research at the cutting edge and to enhance the development of innovations in healthcare and our impact on community health. I look forward to helping all our researchers meet these challenges.

By way of history, my previous role was as the Deputy Director (Research) at Mater Research Institute – The University of Queensland (MRI-UQ) where I was also a NHMRC Principal Research Fellow, with my research team based at the Translational Research Institute (TRI). In that role I oversaw a portfolio covering all biomedical and clinical research activities at the Mater public and private hospitals and MRI-UQ at TRI.

My research interests are focused on mucosal infection, chronic inflammation and cancer in the gastrointestinal tract, and on inflammation in diabetes. I have collaborated with multiple pharmaceutical companies, and have been a key opinion leader for industry for successful licensing applications to the US FDA and Australian TGA. I am heavily involved in national and international peer review, and have served on the NHMRC Academy for both Gastroenerology and Oncology. I am an elected Councillor and President-Elect for the International Society for Mucosal Immunology.

As the University of Melbourne is one of the three stakeholders of AIMSS I am a representative on the Advisory Council of AIMSS, and look forward to helping AIMSS continue to develop its impact in an important area that doesn't receive the amount of attention the scale of the problem deserves. I attended the Forum held at AIMSS in August and was heartened to see the approach to gather multiple disciplines around tackling musculoskeletal disease, and look forward to seeing these collaborations develop and prosper.



From our Director:

AIMSS is "On the Road"

There is a significant gap between major discoveries and their application in clinical practice. For instance, despite having very effective drugs to treat the disease, osteoporosis is only identified and treated in 20% of high-risk patients. Another example is sarcopenia, which despite having an ICD10 code for 2 years, it has not been recognised as a disease in Australia thus limiting the capacity of our general practitioners (GPs) and specialists to identify and treat this disease.

Trying to close this diagnostic and therapeutic gap, and aware that our Australian older population is falling and fracturing at higher rates than other developed countries, AIMSS is now organising the Osteosarcopenia Roadshows as a continuing medical education (CME) workshop designed to update and explain to our GPs the biological mechanisms, diagnostic methods, and treatment of osteoporosis and sarcopenia in older persons, which is relevant and applicable to their own clinical practice. Our team at AIMSS, led by Dr. Sharon Brennan-Olsen and composed by our Exercise Physiologist/Researcher Steven Phu and our Radiographer/Researcher Ebrahim Bani Hassan have done a superb job organising our pilot Roadshows: two in Melbourne and a recent one in Adelaide with a regional one being planned for Ballarat (Victoria) this October. The feedback from the GPs in attendance and their measured learning have been outstanding.

We expect to expand this Roadshows to all over Australia. Don't we surprised if our AIMSS team is passing by near your door one of these days!
